Last week the Boys Engagement Group attended an overnight camp to Lake Burrendong with Mr Whiterod and Ben Lindner to put into practice some of the skills they have learnt in the program during the year. The nine boys undertook a variety of activities including camp craft, camp cooking, navigation and map reading, fishing and team building.

After selecting a suitable campsite to escape the wind the boys set about setting up their swags and tents for what would be a cool night before reading a topographical map and using a compass to plot a course and taking a hike around the northern banks of the dam and visiting the disused spillway. Upon returning to camp a few hours later it was time to cook and the first team prepared a delicious bbg dinner and campfire baked vegetables before playing spotlight and doing some night fishing.

Day two started with the boys cooking bacon and eggs for the supervising staff and was spent tidying up the campsite. After catching a few more redfin perch the boys visited the Burrendong Botanical Gardens and Arboretum for a walk around the impressively landscape gardens and strolled through the massive 5 acre fernery looking at the tropical plant collection.

The boys all exhibited the school PBL values by being respectful, responsible, safe and successful throughout the trip. Mr Whiterod and Ben both commented on how positive all of their interactions with the boys were and noted the outstanding teamwork displayed during activities.
