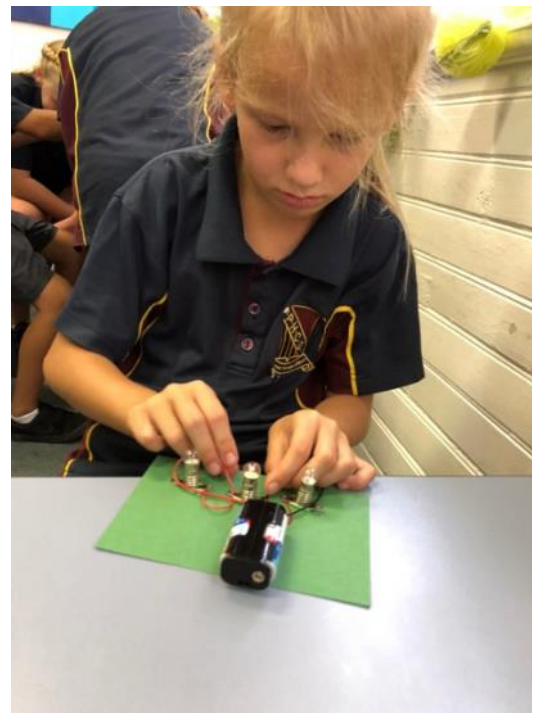
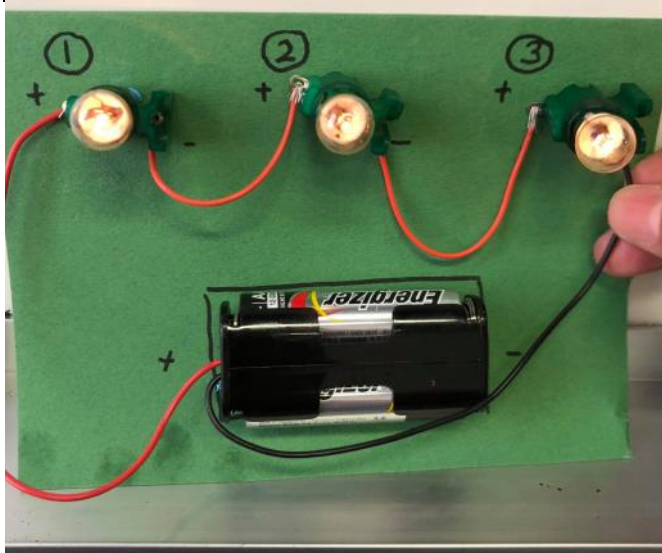

Fire & Rescue NSW Dear Resident.

Fire and Rescue NSW conducts the Home Fire Safety Checks (HFSC) Program. This is a Community Engagement prevention and early intervention initiative which builds capacity and resilience in communities in respect to home fire safety.

We will be conducting this program in **PEAK HILL** on **Monday the 16th of April 2018**.

Firefighters will be knocking on doors in your town & if you are home & you approve, they can check your dwelling to ensure it is fire safe. If not, they can install a Smoke Detector for you right away & advise you on other things you can do to improve your safety.

If you are not at home on this day we will be leaving some information in your letter boxes.
