
Look What's Happening in K/1/2

Welcome back to our final term of the year!


What a busy term we have coming up, with the Athletics Carnival, The Life Education Van, Christmas celebrations and end of term assemblies.








English with Mr Michael Labone

This term Stage 4 will be studying a unit called 'Personal Voices'.


