
Head Teacher Growth and Attainment

Over the past month or so our staff have been examining and analysing our NAPLAN results. We have seen a huge growth in students' writing and numeracy scores. There is also clear evidence in the results that the school is supporting our students through all the programs based around High Expectation Relationships, Attendance and Well Being.

One area we need to really work on is our students' reading, and we can't do that without your support. I know I've said it before, but it is so important for our students to be reading at home. Our Reading Circles have been building a culture of reading at school and students enjoy discussing with their teachers the ideas and vocabulary in the books we are reading. My group have just finished two books, as I mentioned last newsletter we read, The Boy from the Mish, and last week we finished reading a most beautiful book, selected by the students ,The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse, by Charlie Mackesy. After reading both books the students shared their thinking, firstly creating a chart of the lessons learned from The Boy from the Bush, and secondly, drawings of their favourite sayings from the second book this term, The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse.

This fortnight, students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 completed Reading and Numeracy Check-In assessments. All students tried their best in these assessments and we anticipate them finding true "Success through Effort."

In Week 5 we are holding our Annual Book Fair. We have postponed the event a number of times in hopes that restrictions would ease and we would be able to invite parents, carers and community members into the event. Unfortunately, Covid-19 restrictions still prohibit us from doing this, but the show must go on!

On Wednesday 3rd and Thursday 4th of November, all students K-12 will have the opportunity to view the Book Fair and write a wish list of books and items they wish to purchase. They will take these lists home to discuss with parents and carers, then on Friday they will be able to purchase items.

As always, if you require anything or have any questions at all, please do not hesitate to contact myself your child's classroom teacher. We are grateful for your ongoing support.




We sincerely thank Parkes Shire Council and Northparkes Mine for this opportunity and look forward to accepting this grant next week at the presentation ceremony.


