HEAD TEACHER STUDENT GROWTH AND ATTAINMENT

As we reflect on our year at school, this year it has certainly been an interesting one. There are many achievements including surviving the COVID lockdown, through the community working together to support our students. One of the most important things we did as a Literacy Community Team was to hold our Healthy Booris Day which was very much enjoyed by the students and the parents who attended. With the help of Mrs Pam Keed and our young mothers and midwives we were able to raise the importance of reading to your child, from birth! We are very much looking forwardto having a much bigger day next year, after our plans were dashed this year.

This past week I have been conducting reading and comprehension tests for our Year 6 students, who will be part of our Year 7 in high school in 2022. I am so impressed with the reading level of the majority of the students. They are already reading and understanding at a Year 7 level. It will be important for them to maintain their reading so they don't slip behind in the holidays. Even more pleasing was the number of students who said they were getting books as Christmas presents. Many students said their favourite books were David Walliams books, which they had been reading in their Reading Circles. If you have a young reader and are not sure what book to get them, try a David Walliams book, they are very funny.

Over the past year I have written about all the evidence we have about the effect of reading to our children and the importance of encouraging them to read at home. Recently the Education Department produced this little booklet to help parents with some



practical ideas about what to try at home for both literacy and numeracy. It is available download for free online, and copies are available school. One of the reminders in the booklet is that literacy involves listening, speaking,

reading, writing and spelling. Speaking and listening skills build the foundation for your child's learning at school. These skills help a child to be able to talk with others, create friendships and take part in activities at school. Just talking and listening to your child is such an easy yet important thing to do to give your child important communication skills. If you are reading a book together, or your child is reading independently ask them about what happened at the beginning, middle or end of the story. Ask them to tell you about the characters in a story, and create your own story together. Your child is learning about story telling in our culture, and the structure of writing through this simple activity. These are just a few ideas in the booklet, there are more excellent ideas to try in the book, so go ahead and download it for the holidays, or pick up a copy at school.

ACTIVATE DRAMA

This term there has been a lot of fun and students have had the opportunity to act out both funny and serious real-life situations in ACTIVATE Drama. With the help of Mrs Allen and all the costumes she brought in we created a Casino Royale skit, with a thief, a bridal party and a disco. In our last class we were also assisted by Mr. Brendan Allen. Thank you so much for such a fun afternoon. In this ACTIVATE group the students have gained an understanding of the importance of teamwork, and how a team depends on everyone's contribution.
