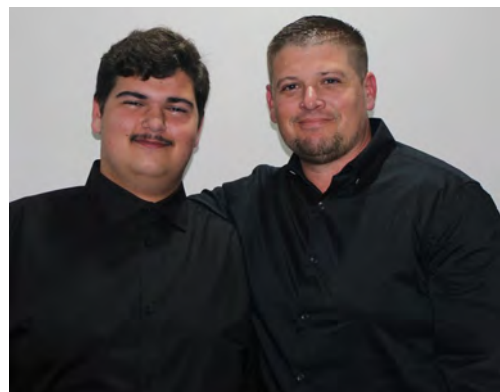

TERM 4 EXCURSION UPDATES

TRANSITIONS

A note was sent home last fortnight, explaining each of the class transitions that would occur as we prepare to move each class into the next stage of their learning for 2023:

- Last Friday a Year 6 into Year 7 Transition note was sent home with students. This transition will begin on Monday 17 October for new students to our school and then the following Monday for our current Year 6 students
- A note will go home early next term, for our KICK START KINDY students, who will begin their transitions into full days each Monday's, part way through next term

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Attendance at school is an important factor in determining the health, wellbeing, success and employability of your child in the future. Being at school every day increases your child's capacity to learn, make and build friendships, develop skills for the "real world" and to improve their resiliency and overall wellbeing. Every fortnight the Regional Attendance Team, which includes Mrs Desray Betts and Ms Tina Heterick visit PHCS to monitor and support the improved attendance of our students from Kindergarten to Year 12. Following our last meeting, we will be sending home certificates to the 108 students who have attended school between 80 – 100% of the time during Term 3. This is a fabulous effort and I know that all our staff are encouraging students to be constantly working on improving their attendance in Term 4!

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is essential for students to achieve quality life outcomes. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. Parents/Carers of children of compulsory school age are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day. Children must commence school by age 6 and then complete Year 10.

After Year 10 and until they turn 17, students must be:

- in school or registered for home schooling or
- in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship) or
- in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours/week) or
- in a combination of work, education and/or training.

Enrolled students 17 years and over are required to attend school regularly to meet the Higher School Certificate course requirements.

ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

Parents/Carers of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Parents/Carers must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

A very sincere thank you to our Parents/Carers and Community members who respectfully share with us their feedback on school related issues. Open, honest and respectful conversations are always welcomed and encouraged. Thank you for your positivity and gratitude for all the hard work and dedication of our staff, and when you can see something that we can improve on, or that we may have overlooked, please let us know. The quicker we know there is an issue, the quicker it can be addressed. Our goal is to better our best every single day.

The social, emotional and educational value of reading is enormous. Please read aloud to your children every day. 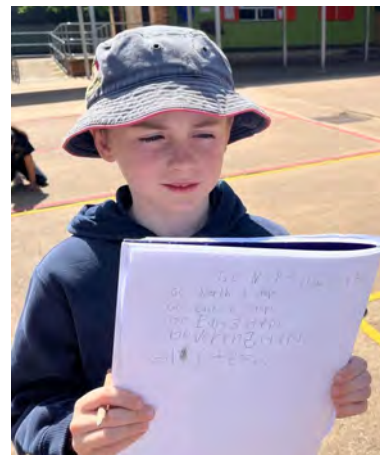
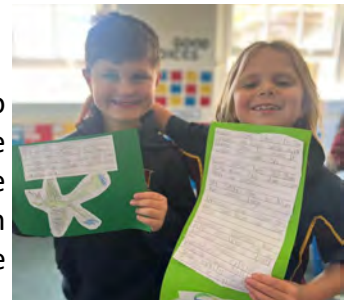
In Literacy, we have been continuing our work on Informative Texts and are learning to include headings and paragraphs in our work. We have also been practicing using similes and contractions.

2/3 had a fantastic time at the Book Parade. It was great to see them all dressed up, having fun, and talking about their favourite books!

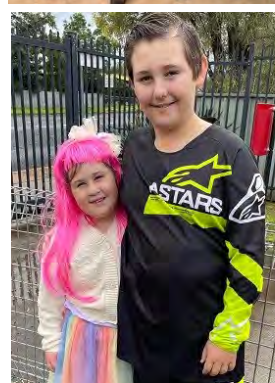

I am so looking forward to getting to know these students and seeing where their learning takes them over the remainder of the year.

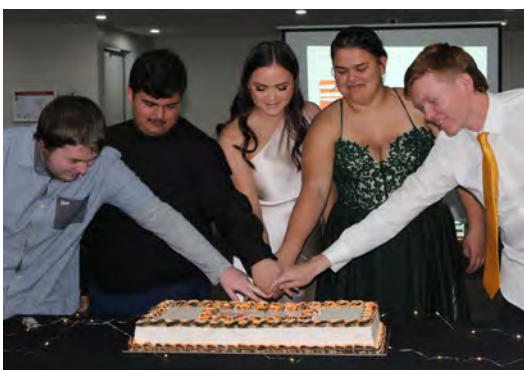

YEAR 4/5

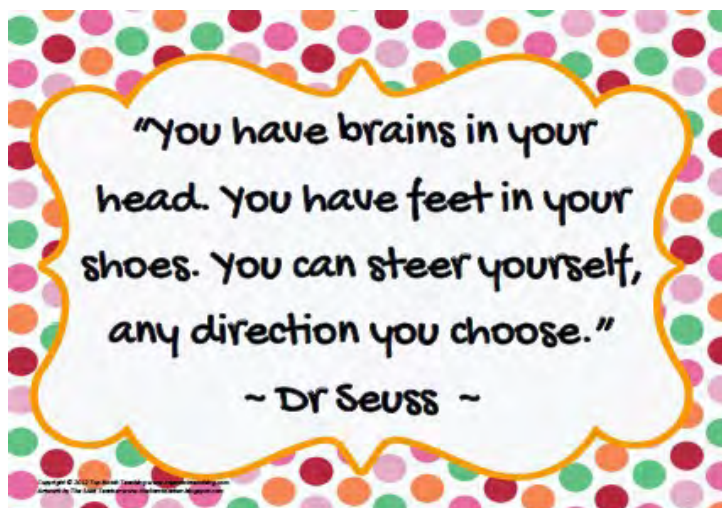
As we come to the end of yet another term in 2022 it is important to focus on the achievements and success in our classroom.

TECHNOLOGY MANDATORY

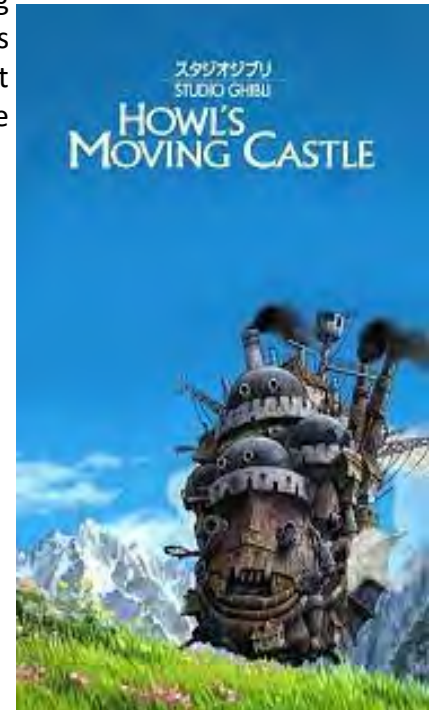

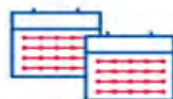

Well done Stage 5 Food Technology - I am so proud of your efforts and continuous creative skills. Keep up the fabulous work!

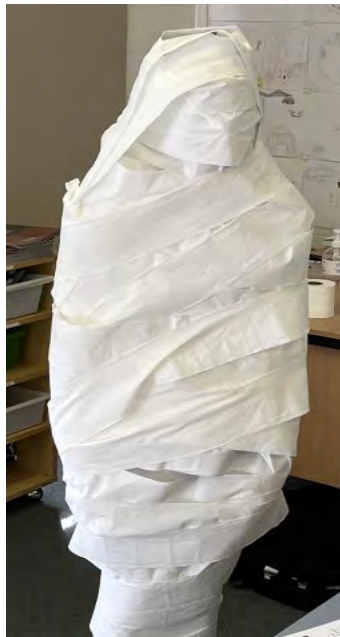
